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## 1 | MISSION AND VISION STATEMENT

#### MISSION STATEMENT

The Mission of Education for Hope is to improve the quality of life and end generational cycles of poverty by empowering the children of Sierra Leone with the tools and resources to be able to read and write, and thus have the ability to chart their own destiny.

#### VISION STATEMENT

Through sustainable partnerships we will work with local communities in Sierra Leone under a co-investment approach to catalyze a strong primary educational beginning including building and renovating schools, providing school supplies, and providing books for libraries. Within two decades we will build or renovate 500 schools equipped with libraries, provide 10,000 backpacks with school supplies to primary school children, and provide libraries with 1,000,000 books.

## 3 2019–2020 ACHIEVEMENTS AND HIGHLIGHTS

Sierra Leone remains one of the poorest nations in Sub-Saharan Africa with a GDP of 14 billion dollars. The country has been plagued with numerous disasters ranging from the rebel war that lasted several years which left scores dead and many institutions devastated to the Ebola virus epidemic that put the country in a standstill. These disasters set the educational system back and it will take decades for it to recover.

Education for Hope (EFH) is playing its part; its primary focus is in rural areas where access to education is very limited or unavailable. Making educating children in this region a priority. Great strides have been made to achieve this goal over the years. EFH continues to build on its success, and as a result, the following objectives have been achieved:

- + Completed the water well project.
- Built a toilet facility.
- + Established a Junior Secondary School (JSS1).
- + Hired trained and qualified teachers to support the primary and secondary schools.
- Provided school supplies and teaching resources to students and teachers.
- + Added additional books and resources to the library.
- Provided housing for the teachers.
